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## Route 495, Route 1&9 / Paterson Plank Road Bridge

The Route 495, Route 1&9/Paterson Plank Road Bridge Rehabilitation Project provided for the complete rehabilitation of the mainline structure and two ramp structures and associated approach roadway improvements. The Route 495 bridge is located at the eastern terminus of the New Jersey Turnpike ramps from Interchanges 16E & 17, at the terminus of State Route 3 as it intersects U.S. Route 1&9, and approximately one mile west of the Lincoln Tunnel entrance. Route 495 passes through one of the most densely populated regions in the United States, is the only vehicular access corridor to midtown Manhattan and has an average daily traffic (ADT) of over 150,000 vehicles. It also serves over 1,800 buses daily which travel in the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey (PANYNJ) Exclusive Bus Lane (XBL) during the weekday morning peak periods from 6 to 10 AM. The XBL moves approximately 65,000 commuters into Manhattan each day of operation and is recognized as one of the most effective transit systems in the Nation. The mainline structure consists of nine spans that carry eight lanes of Route 495 traffic over US-1&9, Liberty Avenue, Paterson Plank Road, Conrail & NYS&W rail lines, and the New Jersey Transit North Bergen Park and Ride Lot.

The bridge was rated as structurally deficient and functionally obsolete, with the last major rehabilitation performed in 1985. The purpose of the project was to completely rehabilitate the bridge and approaches, extending the useful service life of the bridge for an estimated 25 years without significant maintenance required, with an estimated bridge deck service life of 75 years, and to eliminate the need for potential emergency repairs that could significantly disrupt commuter and local traffic.

The presentation will provide information on many of the complexities of completely rehabilitating a complex structure within one of the most densely populated areas of the country and within one of the most congested corridors in the state.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: March 17, 2023.

The Southern New Jersey Section of the American Society of Highway Engineers has established a Southern New Jersey Scholarship for individuals currently enrolled in a Community College or 2 Year Degree Program. Pertinent information and guidelines for eligibility are as follows:

- 1. The amount and number of scholarships will be partly based on the number of qualified applicants. The individual scholarship amounts will be at least \$500.
- 2. The Scholarship Committee will make this award by May 2023.
- 3. Eligible applicants must be enrolled in a civil engineering related degree program (for the 2022-2023 school year).
- 4. The student must reside (or attend a Community College) in one of the following ten (10) counties in New Jersey: Atlantic, Burlington, Cumberland, Camden, Cape May, Gloucester, Mercer, Monmouth, Ocean, or Salem.
- 5. Eligible students must be maintaining at least a 2.5 grade point average.
- 6. Need, as well as scholastics, will be considered for this award.
- 7. The scholarship will only be awarded to an individual one time; however, students who are not awarded the scholarship may re-apply each year they are eligible.
- 8. Only one scholarship from ASHE New Jersey (either Southern New Jersey or North/Central New Jersey) will be given per recipient.

# AMERICAN SOCIETY OF HIGHWAY ENGINEERS (ASHE) SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION – 4/5 YEAR DEGREE PROGRAM

APPLICATION DEADLINE: March 17, 2023.

The Southern New Jersey Section of the American Society of Highway Engineers has established the Southern New Jersey Scholarship. Following is pertinent information and guidelines for eligibility.

- 1. The amount and number of scholarships will be partly based on the number of qualified applicants. The individual scholarship amounts will be a maximum of \$5,000.
- 2. The Scholarship Committee will make this award by May 2023.
- 3. Eligible applicants must be Civil Engineering students successfully in their sophomore, junior or senior year of study (for the 2022-2023 school year).
- 4. The student must reside (or attend a College/University) in one of the following ten (10) counties in New Jersey: Atlantic, Burlington, Cumberland, Camden, Cape May, Gloucester, Mercer, Monmouth, Ocean, or Salem.
- 5. Eligible students must be maintaining at least a 2.5 grade point average.
- 6. Need, as well as scholastics, will be considered for this award.
- 7. The scholarship will only be awarded to an individual one time; however, students who are not awarded the scholarship may re-apply each year they are eligible.

The North Central and Southern New Jersey Sections of the American Society of Highway Engineers (ASHE) invite you to participate in its 2023 Award Program to honor consulting engineering firms, contractors, and transportation officials in their efforts to provide quality roadway facilities in New Jersey.

DEADLINE FOR 2022 ENTRIES: February 17, 2023

Awards will be presented during an ASHE Southern New Jersey and North Central New Jersey joint ceremony to be held in April 2022.

The North Central and Southern New Jersey Sections of the American Society of Highway Engineers (ASHE) invite you to participate in its 2023 Award Program to honor consulting engineering firms, contractors, and transportation officials in their efforts to provide quality roadway facilities in New Jersey.

#### TWO AWARD CATEGORIES!!! UNDER \$10 Million & OVER \$10 Million

This year there will be two (2) Project of the Year Awards. There will be one (1) for projects up to \$10M in total construction cost, and another one (1) for projects over \$10M in total construction cost. The selections will be based on the highest composite score of the following ranking criteria:

- · 25% Complexity
- 25% New Application of Existing Technologies/Originality/Innovation 15% Social/Economic Considerations
- 15% Safety
- 10% Aesthetics and Sustainable Features
- 10% Meeting and Exceeding Owner's/Client's Needs

The winner will be determined based on the highest average score from all judges in each award category. In the event of a numerical tie, the projects with the tie score will be voted on by the judges in a "run-off" style election with each judge casting one vote for the winning project. The project that receives the highest vote total will be the winner.

To be eligible, the project must be a roadway-related construction project located within the State of New Jersey, where construction must have been substantially completed and open to the public in 2021 or 2022 (eligible as long as projected completion is by the end 2022). Non-winning prior year entries may be resubmitted.
